Prenatal and Postpartum Care

Management of normal/physiologic labor & birth in the hospital

Sexual & reproductive healthcare

(ex: STI prevention, testing, & treatment)

Gynecologic & primary care

(ex: pap smears, menstrual or vaginal concerns, annual well-woman/well-person exams, etc.)

Family planning, preconception care, & birth control (ex: pill, patch, ring, Depo, IUD, Nexplanon)





Monitoring the physical, psychological, and social well-being of the pregnant/birthing person throughout the childbearing cycle Providing pregnant/birthing people with individualized education, counseling, and prenatal care, continuous hands-on assistance during labor and birth, and postpartum support

The Midwifery Model of Care

How midwives take care of their clients

Providing evidencebased care and minimizing unnecessary interventions during labor and birth when there are no complications



Working with other specialists such as OB6YNS and/or Maternal-Fetal Medicine physicians When necessary

What is the difference between a Midwife and a Doula?

MIDWIFE

Pregnancy/birth/postpartum/ 6yn ttealthcare Providers

Provide preconception, pregnancy, birth, postpartum, newborn, gynecological, and some primary care healthcare services and education

"Catch" / deliver babies and provide medical care



DOULA

Pregnancy/birth/postpartum Support Professionals

Provide emotional and physical support, education, advocacy, and guidance for navigating pregnancy, birth, and/or the postpartum period.

Do not deliver babies or provide medical care

Midwives and doulas work together to ensure pregnant and birthing people and their families get the best care possible and feel supported during their pregnancy, birth, and postpartum period.



What is the difference between a Midwife and an OB/GYN?

MIDWIFE

Pregnancy/birth/postpartum/ 6yn Healthcare Providers

Practice according to Midwifery Model of Care

Experts in the "normal", or physiologic pregnancy/birth

OB/GYN

Pregnancy/birth/postpartum/ 6yn Healthcare Providers

> Practice according to Medical Model of Care

Experts in managing complications of pregnancy

Surgeons
