

Affinia Healthcare, The Haven of Grace cook up partnership for healthier living

Affinia Healthcare and The Haven of Grace are cooking up a new partnership to help pregnant and unhoused women in the St. Louis area.

The nonprofits have entered a partnership to provide monthly cooking and nutrition sessions to current residents of The Haven of Grace, an organization that provides support to pregnant and unhoused women. The Affinia Healthcare WIC nutritionists will provide the food and other cooking supplies, as well as lead the sessions. The Haven of Grace will select participants and provide the facilities for the sessions. The partnership will run through June 2025.

"We're helping our moms learn an important life skill -- cooking healthy foods for the entire family,"

said Affinia Healthcare WIC Director Kristen Gore. "In our field, we hear it all the time -- moms want to make sure that their families eat healthier but may need additional resources and support to make it happen."

In addition to cooking demonstrations, this will be an opportunity for the participants to meet and speak with a Registered Dietitian about nutritional concerns. Breastfeeding support will also be offered through the breastfeeding peer counselors. Program leaders hope the support and education will lead to families choosing and preparation of more healthy and nutritious meals to maintain a healthier lifestyle.

This partnership is just another way that Affinia Healthcare is helping to close the gap and helping patients overcome these barriers."

This partnership is also an example of Affinia Healthcare's initiatives to incorporate the 'Food is Medicine' philosophy as part of a holistic approach to healthcare.

Affinia Healthcare has several

food security initiatives and partnerships. The community health center has partnerships with the St. Louis Area Foodbank where it distributes free food to the public at its South Broadway and Biddle Street locations monthly. Affinia Healthcare also sponsors stops for the St. Louis MetroMarket at the S. Broadway, Biddle and new Ferguson location. The St. Louis MetroMarket brings fresh produce and select groceries to communities considered food deserts.



Affinia Healthcare is nationally recognized for efforts to improve blood pressure control

Affinia Healthcare has been recognized by the American Heart Association and American Medical Association for its commitment to improving blood pressure (BP) control rates, earning Silver-level recognition as part of Target: BP™.

The Silver award recognizes practices that have demonstrated a commitment to improving blood pressure control through measurement accuracy.

High blood pressure, or hypertension, is a leading risk factor for heart attacks, strokes and preventable death in the U.S. There are 122.4 million U.S. adults living with hypertension. The is nearly half of all adults in the country. Unfortunately, just a quarter of them have their BP under control, making both diagnosis and effective management critical. In the U.S., heart disease and stroke are the No. 1 and No. 5 causes of death. respectively, and stroke is a leading cause of disability.

"Addressing blood pressure



management is key for better cardiovascular health - and critical today, when heart disease and stroke continue to be leading causes of death for adults in the U.S.," said Dr. Kendra Holmes, Affinia Healthcare President & CEO. "According to the American Heart Association, 55 percent of African Americans have high blood pressure, which is a leading risk factor of heart disease and stroke. But high blood pressure can be prevented or managed if diagnosed and treated properly. I'm extremely proud of our Chronic Disease Management team and the work of our clinicians and other staff who are working with patients to help control and prevent this condition in our communities."

Target: BP is a national initiative

formed by the American Heart Association and American Medical Association in response to the high prevalence of uncontrolled blood pressure. The initiative aims to help health care organizations and care teams, at no cost, improve blood pressure control rates through an evidence-based quality improvement program and recognizes organizations, like Affinia Healthcare that are committed to improving blood pressure control.

"By committing to helping more people in the St. Louis area control their blood pressure and reduce their risks for future heart disease and stroke, Affinia Healthcare is taking a key step to helping more people live longer, healthier lives," said Yvonne Commodore-Mensah, PhD, MHS, RN, FAHA, Target: BP advisory group volunteer and associate professor at Johns Hopkins School of Nursing. "Affinia Healthcare's participation in the Target: BP initiative shows its dedication to turning clinical guidelines into lifelines for patients and their families."

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New WIC Clinic Opens in St. Louis Children's Hospital

Affinia Healthcare announces the opening of a new WIC clinic in St. Louis Children's Hospital. The clinic will be open Monday-Friday, for hospital patients only. The location opened September 30, 2024.

WIC is a special supplemental nutrition program providing services to pregnant women, new mothers,

infants, and children up to their 5th birthday based on nutritional risk and income eligibility. The primary services provided are healthy, supplemental food, risk assessment, nutrition education and counseling, breastfeeding promotion and support, health screenings, and referrals to health care.

To be eligible for WIC, applicants must have an income of less than

or equal to 185 percent of the poverty level and be at nutritional risk.

The new clinic is located at St. Louis Children's Hospital, One Children's Hospital Place near the Central West End, and will serve those families with children who are patients at the hospital.

"Affinia Healthcare is extremely proud to work with St. Louis Children's Hospital to provide these vital services to families who have children receiving care at the hospital," said Kristen Gore, Affinia Healthcare WIC Director. "Providing high-quality care to families is the core of what we do and to be able to work with a nationally recognized organization like St. Louis Children's Hospital to help alleviate some of the other concerns families may be dealing with, is an honor and a privilege."

The Affinia Healthcare WIC program also has offices at the organization's health centers and satellite locations throughout the St. Louis metro area.

WIC supplemental food packages are specially chosen to provide foods

high in protein, iron, calcium, and vitamins A and C. Eligible women and children receive fortified milk and cheese, eggs, whole grain bread products, hot or cold cereals, 100% fruit juices, and fresh or frozen fruits and vegetables. The WIC program recommends breastfeeding and provides breastfeeding support, baby foods, and infant cereal. For women who cannot or choose not to breastfeed, infants may receive supplemental, ironfortified formula. WIC participants obtain their foods using their eWIC cards for specific items at participating local grocery stores and pharmacies.

Affinia Healthcare receives grants for immigrant care, urban garden

Affinia Healthcare is proud to announce it has received a grant for \$41,000 from the Lutheran Foundation of St. Louis.

The grant will be used to improve access and utilization of healthcare services for more than 600 newly arrived immigrants through the employment of a Community Health Worker to help connect them to Affinia Healthcare's medical, dental, behavioral health and other providers.

This is the second grant Affinia Healthcare has received from the Lutheran Foundation in the last 18 months for services for immigrant communities. In 2023, Affinia Healthcare received \$63,000 from the Lutheran Foundation of St. Louis, also for services to immigrant communities.

"Affinia Healthcare is grateful for the support of the Lutheran Foundation as it allows us to continue our mission of reaching underserved populations in the St. Louis area," said Dr. Kendra Holmes, President & CEO, Affinia Healthcare. "These funds will allow our new neighbors to access needed and high-quality healthcare services in a welcoming environment as they begin to establish their new lives in the St. Louis area."

Affinia Healthcare serves as the primary care home for most of the newly arrived refugees and other immigrants who often lack health insurance access, caring for over 4,000 immigrants on an annual basis.

Lutheran Foundation of St. Louis is the grant-making ministry of 74 St. Louis area Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod congregations. The Foundation's vision is to see the Church brought into the lives of hurting people and people included in the healing life of the Church.

Ameren Support for Urban Garden

The Ameren Corporation has awarded a 2024 Community Impact Grant for \$10,000 to Affinia Healthcare to support development of an urban garden. Affinia Healthcare is partnering with the Episcopal Diocese of Missouri in Old North St. Louis to develop an urban garden in the 63106 ZIP Code which is considered a food desert. Affinia Healthcare received a \$30,000 grant earlier this year from the National Association of Community Health Centers, which will also be used for the urban garden in Old North St. Louis.
