# New rain gardens project to improve environmental wellness

Affinia Healthcare will soon break ground on two amended soils areas, one pervious concrete area and four rain gardens at the health center located at 1717 Biddle Street.

The program will help manage rain where it falls by installing rainscaping site improvements that reduce local flooding and manage stormwater runoff, while also improving water quality in the Mississippi River.

St. Louis Project Clear Large Stormwater Grants Program, an initiative led by the Metropolitan Sewer District (MSD), is funding this project. The \$600,000 grant will pay for infrastructure improvements which will bring high performing systems to the site.

"This project is an opportunity to improve our property by offering access to beautiful natural spaces on-site and contribute to citywide efforts to be better stewards of our environment," said Chris Overmann, Assistant Vice President of Operations and New Business Development. "The \$600,000 grant pays for infrastructure improvements that will bring these high performing systems to our parking lot."

Rainscaping is the use of natural vegetation and systems to manage rainwater. The rainscaping improvements are amended soil areas, pervious concrete and rain gardens. Rain gardens are bowlshaped gardens that capture and clean rainwater using native plants and special

soils. The amended soils areas are mixed with compost and planted with native vegetation. The pervious concrete area will provide a sustainable location for parking the mobile medical and dental units.

The project was developed by Greenprint Partners, a missiondriven delivery partner helping other organizations to achieve high-impact, community-driven stormwater solutions. "Rainscaping reduces local flooding, manages stormwater runoff and helps reduce pollution that would otherwise flow into the Mississippi River," said Greenprint Partners Associate Engineer Lucy Kopchak. "The amended soil areas and rain gardens help absorb rainwater, allowing it to drain directly into the soil."

Construction is expected to be completed by October 2025.

include: women's health, pediatrics, family medicine, radiology, pharmacy, dental care, behavioral health, and WIC services. Patients can also receive assistance with Medicaid applications.

In addition to these services, the Lemp Avenue health center is home to Affinia Healthcare's Convenience (formerly urgent) Care. The Convenience Care takes walk-in appointments for a variety of needs including asthma care, vaccinations and immunizations, physicals, STI testing and treatment, pregnancy testing, colds & flu, and more.

The Open House took place from 9 a.m. to noon on Monday, Sept. 8 at 2220 Lemp Avenue. The event was filled with giveaways, free health resources, refreshments, and other information for community members.

# Additional pain relief option now available

Cetacaine, the new topical anesthetic spray option for patients to request for IUD insertions, endometrial

biopsies and colposcopies.

Affinia Healthcare is now offering an additional pain management option for common in-office gynecological procedures such as intrauterine device (IUD) insertions, endometrial biopsies and colposcopies.

Patients considering the IUD, a small T-shaped device used for birth control, now have the option of using a topical numbing spray prior to the procedure. Other methods of pain management offered are oral medications, or local anesthesia injections such as an intracervical or paracervical block.

"We emphasize shared decision making and discussion about expected pain from these

procedures and the options to manage their pain," said OB/GYN and Assistant Medical Director of Reproductive Health Dr. Jessica Norton. "We all feel pain differently and I think the goal is to talk about the pain ahead of time and all the different options for patients."

According to a newly released Clinical Consensus Guideline from the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG), healthcare providers need a better understanding of pain management options for these common procedures to not underestimate the patients pain experience and to increase patient autonomy over pain control. ACOG recommends healthcare providers ask patients their preferences, listen to their answers, and offer and explain their pain management options.

The expansion of pain management options

at Affinia Healthcare has heightened significance for African American patients, as inequity and discrimination in women's healthcare has historically and disproportionately impacted Black women.

"For generations, Black women in the United States have endured inequities in gynecologic care, often receiving less pain management, less informed consent, and less respect for their bodily autonomy," said Affinia Healthcare President and CEO Dr. Kendra Holmes. "These inequities are rooted in a historical narrative that falsely claimed Black people have a higher tolerance for pain. This belief, born from slavery, has been perpetuated throughout modern medicine and results in generational trauma."

This new topical numbing spray is now available at all Affinia Healthcare health centers and providers are to discuss this option with patients prior to the procedure.

"Women's pain was just not being heard or valued. Since rolling this out, I've had a lot of patients say 'yes, please' and I've even had some patients to say 'no, thank you'," Dr. Norton added. "I think just making it patient-centered is the key."

Affinia Healthcare offers comprehensive women's health services which include midwifery, group prenatal care, and WIC services.

# Affinia Healthcare and A.T. Still University partner for Physician Assistant program to increase community health clinicians

Affinia Healthcare and long-time partner, A.T. Still University (ATSU) are collaborating to increase the number of clinicians and healthcare access for the community.

The Central Coast Physician Assistant (CCPA)
Program was developed in partnership with the National
Association of Community Health Centers as a postbaccalaureate option for graduates interested in pursuing
a career as a Physician Assistant. Launched in 2021,
CCPA is a two-year master's degree program, consisting
of one year of didactic education at the A.T. Still
University-College for Healthy Communities campus in
Santa Maria, Calif. The second year is the clinical portion
of the training which occurs at community health centers
like Affinia Healthcare.

The clinical curriculum consists of 44 credit hours and exposes students to different disciplines and different environments. In the past, Affinia Healthcare has hosted up to four students who spent five six-week rotations in four different departments — family medicine, pediatrics, behavioral health, and obstetrics. Affinia Healthcare recently hosted four students in the clinical phase of the program.

"I've truly enjoyed my time with each department I've worked with so far. Through rotations in family and internal medicine, behavioral health, and pediatrics at Affinia [Healthcare], I've gained insight into many different aspects of patient care," said Truc Kha, a recent graduate of the program.

This real-life experience allows students to put into practice what they have learned in the classroom.

"We focus on students and teaching that is community-based, patient-centered and trauma-informed primary care," said Dr. Melissa Tepe, Affinia Healthcare Vice President & Chief Medical Officer. "Students practice with a collaborating physician to help train them to be strong, competent clinicians."

"I've seen how access, education and trust play important roles in health outcomes," said Roman Lopez, another CCPA graduate. "I've also learned that healthcare delivery requires constant communication, teamwork and adaptability. Every staff member -- from the front desk to providers -- contributes to the patient's experience."

Affinia Healthcare employs physician assistants in its health centers to help ensure a primary care workforce for the future in communities that have a need for additional healthcare access.

"Ultimately, my goal is to serve the underserved communities, and work in a teaching establishment where I get the opportunity to be a preceptor to future clinicians," Lopez added.

#### **Hometown Help**

The ATSU Hometown Scholars Program helps CCPA applicants during the review process. Applicants enlist a community health leader to advocate on their behalf during the enrollment process. While it is not required for admission, applicants in the Hometown Scholars Program can receive an automatic interview should applicants meet the requirements. The hope is that this endorsement will encourage students to return home to practice.

"The Hometown Scholars Program supports local people who'd want to complete their clinical training at Affinia Healthcare and consider employment at Affinia after graduation. Having clinicians from the community can be very important in reaching the community being served," Tepe added.

# The Women's Safe House, Affinia Healthcare join forces to support domestic violence survivors

The Women's Safe House (TWSH) and Affinia Healthcare have entered a partnership to provide healthcare services to survivors of domestic violence through a new offering, The Health and DV Program.

Survivors of domestic and sexual abuse, human trafficking, sexual assault, and stalking seeking help from TWSH will now receive primary and preventative healthcare services through this partnership.

"Survivors who have broken free from a traumatic environment need a wide range of supports to help them recover and move to the next chapter of their lives," said Candace Henderson, Director, Community Health. "Often, they are starting over and support for their physical and mental well-being makes for a strong foundation. We are honored to provide these services at this critical point in their lives to help survivors rebuild and move forward."

The Health and DV Program is designed to support underserved members of the community who have experienced trauma due to domestic violence and related forms of abuse. Affinia Healthcare will accept referrals from TWSH for primary and secondary survivors (women and children) and deliver medical, dental, psychological and other services within 24-48 hours of the referral. Affinia Healthcare will also provide transportation for

TWSH also agrees to provide comprehensive support services – including safety planning and advocacy – to all individuals referred by or connected to Affinia Healthcare due to DV-related concerns.

survivors (when available or necessary) and offer on-site

TWSH also agrees to provide comprehensive support services to all individuals referred by or connected to Affinia Healthcare due to domestic abuse-related concerns. These services include — but are not limited to - crisis intervention hotline, safety planning, advocacy, emergency shelter, case management, counseling, legal aid, housing assistance, and 12 months of aftercare.


Also a part of the agreement is for staff from both organizations to participate in ongoing training focused on identifying and responding to domestic violence.

"While some effects of DV are immediately visible – like bruises or broken bones – others may not surface until later," said Aja Buie, TWSH Director of Residential Services. "Conditions like gastrointestinal issues, cardiovascular problems, and other chronic illnesses are

empowerment starts here. break free live free often overlooked, yet may stem directly from abuse. Through this program, TWSH and Affinia aim to remove systemic barriers to care for those traditionally underserved by the healthcare system."

The partnership began in June 2025 and will run for a year, with an option to renew after June 2026.
